Since 1946, the Aloha Festivals Royal Court has played an essential role in the Aloha Festivals, serving as a symbol of Hawaiian heritage passed down through generations of Hawaiians. The 2012 Royal Court will appear at all Aloha Festivals events this September, kicking off the 66th Annual Aloha Festivals on September 6 with the Royal Court Investiture at 3:00 p.m. at the Hilton Hawaiian Village, and Opening Ceremony at 5:00 p.m. at the Royal Hawaiian Center, Royal Grove.

Selection of the Royal Court was based on the following criteria: Hawaiian ancestry, ability to make various appearances during the reigning year from September 2012 to August 2013, and age requirements of 35 and older for king and queen

Promotion to support the Culinary Institute of the Pacific

Halekulani, celebrated for its personalized service, masterful cuisine and innovation, invites guests to experience a special month-long series of dinner menus following the acclaimed annual Hawaii Food & Wine Festival.

Specially created for each of Halekulani's restaurants by Executive Chef Vikram Garg, in concert with Pastry Chef Mark Freischmidt, this eco-inspired epicurean experience uses ingredients sourced in Hawaii, in an effort to support local farmers, in practice of "Sourcing Locally, Cooking Globally."

"Each restaurant showcases a multi-course menu offered with a wine pairing. While each menu is inspired by a different global region, the overriding theme is one of sustainability and corporate responsibility in supporting an environmentally conscious philosophy," said Ulrich Krauer, General Manager of Halekulani.

From the mountains to the sea, from Hilo to Hanalei, the bounty of the Islands is fully evident in its ties to the land; Chef Garg sourced ingredients such as fresh hearts of palm, nurtured high on the slopes of Hawai'i, and the only place in the country to produce hearts of palm; and Kahuku Farms eggplant, grown by third-generation family farmers who grew up as neighbors in the close knit North Shore enclave.

From the ocean, culinary offerings include sweet-tasting Kaua'i shrimp, naturally grown in saltwater from the pristine coastline of the Garden Isle; and Kona lobsters, swimming in its deep seawater pens filled with clear, clean, cold seawater, at one of the largest live Maine Lobster holding facilities outside the Atlantic seaboard. A key feature on the Orchids menu, *Poached Kona Lobster, Hearts of Palm Carpaccio, Cardamom Lemon Curd,* was a signature dish at the 2011 Hawaii Food & Wine Festival gala dinner.

A stunning display of talent by island musician Kamakakehau Fernandez has earned him the winning title of this year's 4th annual Kani Ka Pila Grille Talent Search. The five finalists were initially selected based on a sample music performance submitted by DVD or online link, and later evaluated by their final performances on Saturday, August 18, 2012, at the Made in Hawaii Festival. Fernandez receives a one-month paid contract to perform weekly this September at Kani Ka Pila Grille, located poolside Outrigger Reef on the Beach, as well as complimentary studio time at Honolulu Community College's Mike Curb MELE Studios.

"Kamakakehau's traditional Hawaiian songs and smooth falsetto voice impressed the judges and wowed the crowd at this year's Kani Ka Pila Grille Talent Search," said Luana Maitland, ambassador of aloha and music director at Kani Ka Pila Grille. "We can't wait to introduce him to our guests in September – his music will definitely be a special treat for our patrons."

Fernandez will be performing at Kani Ka Pila Grille every Thursday night throughout the month of September and at Waikiki Beach Walk on October 30. Additionally, the four remaining finalists from the talent search will perform for one night each per week at both Kani Ka Pila Grille and Waikiki Beach Walk throughout the month of October. 
