WIA has ambitious agenda for 2017

The Waikīkī Improvement Association has a lot to do in 2017.

Bring Back the Beach-The agenda includes managing the Waikīkī Beach Special Improvement District Association. The first major WBSIDA project is to provide a required private sector match (50%) of the total for the Royal Hawaiian groin (RHG) replacement project (\$750,000). That RHG is in imminent danger of collapsing, in which case the entire beach Diamond Head of the groin to the Kūhiō Beach Basins is in danger of disappearing. Permitting for the project will take most of 2017 with construction to begin in 2018.

The next major priority is to develop a comprehensive Waikīkī Beach Management Plan (WBMP) in conjunction with the State Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) and University of Hawaii Sea Grant Program. The DLNR awarded a contract of \$800,000 for the WBMP to “Sea Engineering” and began work on the project in December with an expected 18 to 24-month duration. The contract includes identifying the next beach projects and providing permitting and design support. WBSIDA and UH Sea Grant will provide public outreach support. Future projects to receive funding would be decided by the WBSIDA. Any projects would be subject to all appropriate government permits and approvals.

Waikīkī Transportation Management (WTMA)- Traffic congestion, particularly at the most popular loading and unloading areas, creates a definite challenge going forward. WIA has assumed the active role of a “Waikīkī Transportation Management Association” to work with the City and other Waikīkī stakeholders to improve access and to better manage traffic in Waikīkī. WIA has prepared plans to advance assess and parking to Waikīkī in 2017.

Kalākaua Sidewalk Improvements- The use of quartzite pavers on sidewalks in the City and private sector projects on Kalākaua and Kūhiō Avenues contribute greatly to making Waikīkī a world class destination resort. For this reason and for the sake of consistency, WIA has worked with the City to incorporate quartzite pavers in the remaining unimproved sidewalk areas along Kalākaua Avenue. The first phase was completed in November, 2011. Phase two construction will take place in 2017.

Waikīkī Special District Design Guidelines In 2016 WIA submitted to the City Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) a draft rewrite of the Waikīkī Special District Design Guidelines. WIA continues to work with DPP and hope to see the revised guidelines issued by June 2017.

Homeless Issues- Waikīkī stakeholders continue to work with the city administration and council to reduce homelessness in Waikīkī. Waikīkī's partners in this effort include the Hawaii Lodging & Tourism Association (HLTA), the Institute for Human Services, the Waikīkī Business Improvement District Association and the Waikīkī Health Center.

Mobile Kiosks- WIA and the WBIDA plan to work with Waikīkī's member of the City Council Trevor Ozawa to pass new legislation to limit or remove these promotional mobile kiosks that have proliferated on Kalākaua Avenue Sidewalks.

Ala Wai Watershed Partnership (AWWP) WIA and WBSIDA are playing a central role in the AWWP, a diverse public-private stakeholder group committed to an ambitious action plan to clean up the Ala Wai Watershed to and to improve the function and water quality of the Ala Wai Canal.

Enriching the cultural content and amenities of Waikīkī — In partnership with the City and County of Honolulu and the Hawai'i Tourism Authority, WIA manages the **Kūhiō Beach Hula and Torch lighting Show** at the Kūhiō Beach Mound. In 2016 WIA initiated a new **"Waikīkī Hula Program"** inviting international hula participants to Waikīkī for workshop(s) and to perform. WIA members sponsor the **Waikīkī New Year's Fireworks Display**. WIA continued to partner with the City to produce sponsored **Sunset on the Beach** Events. Three time a year WIA conducts a Waikīkī Beach Clean-up with the support of the WIA Waikīkī 'Ohana Workforce (WOW) committee.

Additionally, in 2017 WIA continues a very successful management agreement with **Aloha Festivals**. The efficiency of the arrangement played an important role in the survival and current success of this important visitor related cultural program which includes the Waikīkī Hoolaulea and the Aloha Festivals Floral Parade.

Providing these activities for both visitors and residents to enjoy, we enhance our status as a world class destination.

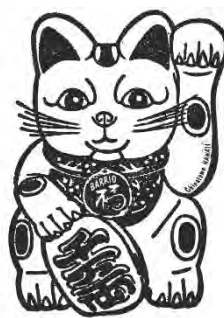
