Sponsored by the members of the Waikīkī Improvement Association, the New Year's fireworks show will start at 11:55 pm on December 31st. From a barge just off Waikīkī Beach, one announcement salute will be fired

every minute until 1 minute before midnight. Stay tuned for more information \ to enjoy music choreographed by Fireworks by Grucci to accompany and enhance your viewing experience. If you are not next to your radio... use your smart phone and download the **Fireworks by Grucci app** and all you need to do is click the **Waikīkī Improvement Association Logo**, or go to: **waikīkiimprovement.com**.

You can listen from anywhere! Exactly at midnight a barrage of colorful salutes will signal the start of the New Year, accompanied by Auld Lang Syne. Listen and you may hear your favorite local artist celebrate New Year's with a BANG. The 10 - 12 minute fireworks show will include designs of palm trees, rings, strobes, sparkling fans, colorful falling leaves, brocades and willows falling to the ocean. The show will end with the famous Grucci Grand Finale. More than 1,800 shells will be fired during the show.

More than 100,000 kama`aina and visitors will view this extravaganza of light and color launched from an offshore barge, visible all along Waikiki Beach. It will be a show worthy of our world-class destination and also symbolizes Waikīkī Improvement Association members practicing the spirit of Lokahi - or unity as they have all come together to make this event possible.

## Sheraton Waikiki celebrates the "12 Days Of Christmas" in Sandsational Style

Koi in the pond, poke boards, ukulele, beanbags in the pool, surfing Santas, swimming turtles, hula lessons, flower lei, pool towels, kalua pigs, mai tais at RumFire and a menehune with a Christmas tree...are all part Sheraton Waikiki's sandsational holiday display this year. In what is the largest sand sculpture ever created at the hotel, the display is a festive countdown depicting 12 Days of Sheraton Waikiki Christmas.

Sandsational Sand Sculpting, a company based in Melbourne, Fla., has put the finishing touches on the second of two holiday sculptures at the hotel. According to Jill Harris of Sandsational, the first one was completed on November 9, uses 8 tons of sand, and portrays Santa enjoying mai tais at hotspot RumFire, as well as a menehune with a Christmas tree as the second and first day of Christmas, respectively. These are in the main lobby, while the second sculpture in the Sheraton Waikiki Porte Cochere took 50 tons of sand and features the third through 12<sup>th</sup> days of Christmas.

This year, Harris and Thomas Koet, who have been the main architects of the sand sculptures at Sheraton Waikiki, were joined by another artist, Susanne Ruseler, for the larger sculpture and both sculptures took more than 250 hours over nearly three weeks to complete.

Since 2006, Sandsational has been creating visually stunning masterpieces in the Sheraton Waikiki lobby. Past sculptures have been a tribute to the Mālama Honua voyage by the Hōkūle'a canoe and a Samoan warrior's knife dance, performed before battle with the *nifo oti*, or "tooth of death" with the sculpture titled "Fireknife Dancers." This past year featured Nāmaka, the sea goddess, and older sister of fire goddess Pele.

"Being on Waikiki Beach during the holidays is a dream for many and these sand sculptures capture the fun and magic of the most wonderful time of the year," says Area General Manager Kelly Sanders, who is credited with bringing Sandsational to the Sheraton Waikiki, which remains the only hotel in Hawaii to feature sand sculptures of any kind.

The sand sculptures are huge draws for the thousands of guests who come to Sheraton Waikiki for holiday events and gatherings. The sculptures are expected to remain at the hotel through early 2018 when a new sculpture will be made in the lobby.

## Hilton Hawaiian Village's Chef Joseph "JJ" Reinhart to compete in World's Largest Culinary Competition

Chef JJ's award-winning chili recipe qualifies for the World Food Championships

Hilton Hawaiian Village Waikiki Beach Resort is proud to announce that its very own Chef de Cuisine Joseph "JJ" Reinhart will be competing in the World Food Championships (WFC), the largest competition in Food Sport, where grand champions of previous events convene for a chance at winning the ultimate food crown and a share of hundreds of thousands of dollars in prize money. Reinhart will specifically compete in the World Open Chili Championship, one of 10 events within the WFC.

Reinhart recently took first place at the inaugural Chef's Chili Challenge at the 2017 Made in Hawaii Festival, an automatic qualifying event for the World Open Chili Championship. Reinhart will be competing on Team Hawaii along with Executive Chef James Aptakin of Turtle Bay Resort, who will be participating in the seafood category and is also the reigning 2016 World Seafood Champion. Yim Martinez, a graduate of the Kapiolani Community College's culinary programs, will also be representing the school on Team Hawaii in the steak category.

All of the Team Hawaii chefs will be using Hawaii products and ingredients to help showcase the bounty that the islands have to offer.

"It was a privilege being recognized at the Made in Hawaii Festival among so many respected and talented local chefs and food vendors," said Reinhart. "I'm looking forward to representing Hawaii in the chili category and hope it will alert more of the national audience to the great culinary heritage of our Hawaiian Islands."


## Hawaii Tourism Authority appoints Jennifer Chun as Director of Tourism Research


The Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA) announced today that Jennifer Chun has been appointed as the agency's Director of Tourism Research, starting December 1.


