## Hoʻowehiwehi Award — Call for Entries

2012 marks the seventh year that the Waikīkī Improvement Association honors those in the community whose projects possess the key components of the Revitalization of Waikīkī plan which began in 2001.

Ho`owehiwehi Awards are now celebrated yearly. Submit your nominees by August 31 (form attached). There are four categories: Hāna Nui, Hāna Iki, Pili Honua and George S. Kanahele 'Ho'okipa' Award. The submission form is attached. A committee of professional planners and executives will be responsible for selecting award recipients.

## Hawaiian's 94.7% On-Time Performance Led Nation's Carriers in May

Hawaiian Airlines led the nation's 15 largest carriers in on-time performance during the month of May, according to the *Air Travel Consumer Report* issued today by the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT).

Hawaiian earned the DOT's #1 ranking with its flights arriving on time at a rate of 94.7 percent, exceeding the industry average by 11.3 percentage points.

In the category of fewest flight cancellations, Hawaiian was barely edged out of the top spot for May despite having only three cancellations out of 6,246 total flights, or less than 0.1 percent. Hawaiian provides daily nonstop service to Hawai'i from 11 gateway cities in North America – more cities than any other carrier – using Airbus A330-200 and Boeing 767-300 aircraft, making it the only carrier to offer wide-body, twin-aisle aircraft for all transpacific flights.

Hawai'i's largest and longest-serving carrier is also the leading provider of air service between the islands of Hawai'i.

## Historic photos of Hawai'i's Boat Days in Honolulu on exhibit at the Royal Hawaiian, A Luxury Collection Resort

The Royal Hawaiian, a Luxury Collection Resort has partnered with Matson Navigation Company to present "Boat Days" exhibit showcasing a collection of rarely seen photographs of visitors traveling to Oahu on Matson ship

liners. On July 18, prized images revealing archived photos of passengers arriving in Honolulu from the late 1920s to the late 1940s and their visits to The Royal Hawaiian and Hawaii will be open to the public. The exhibit will be on display at the resort's Coronet Lounge until January 31, 2013 with no admission fee.

This rare collection of photographs features the S.S. Lurline, Hula Boat Day greeting of passengers arriving at Aloha Tower, The Royal Hawaiian Band playing music at Aloha Tower, original Royal Hawaiian luggage tags, a variety of Matson travel posters, and more. Starting in the mid-1920s, visitors from all over the world began arriving at Aloha Tower on Matson passenger ships and vacationing at The Royal Hawaiian enjoying the exotic wonders offered on Waikiki Beach. Each photograph will be presented on large canvas prints lining the walls of Coronet Lounge.

Lurline Boat Days

Matson Navigation Company was instrumental in the development of tourism to Hawaii and the South Pacific. A fleet of Matson Lines cruise ships, the most famous being the *S.S. Lurline*, traveled from the mainland to Hawaii from the 1920s to 1960s. Matson built The Royal Hawaiian in 1927 so luxury accommodations were both available afloat and ashore. Matson photographers took thousands of snapshots of the celebrities and world-class travelers who traveled on its ships and vacationed in Waikiki.

Matson Navigation Company Archives encompass a vast collection of photographs and artwork from Matson Lines passenger and hotel era, 1920s to 1960s.



Christina and her confections have appeared on Martha Stewart, Live with Regis & Kelly, Conan, and The Today Show among others. Represents improvements to a particular structure or environment completed between October 2011 and August 31, 2012.

#### Hawaiian Airlines Improves Neighbor Island Affordability, Access New Fare Structure, Expanded Fleet Aimed at Kama'äina Customer

Hawaiian Airlines today implemented a new fare structure for neighbor island travel that lowers ticket prices across all of its fare classes from 4 to 25 percent.

The new rates, which are available for booking today on <u>www.HawaiianAir.com</u>, are designed to stimulate increased kama'äina travel.

Under the new fare structure, the lowest fare for a one-way nonstop interisland flight (including taxes and mandatory federal fees) is \$65 for travel from Honolulu to Kahului and Lïhu'e.

The new structure's three lowest fares from Honolulu to Kahului, Lïhu'e, Hilo and Kona are all lower than the previously published lowest web fare (see chart below).

In addition, the airline's parent company, Hawaiian Holdings, has signed a Letter of Intent to acquire turbo-prop aircraft with the aim of establishing a subsidiary carrier to serve routes not currently in Hawaiian's neighbor island system.

"We are committed to providing safe, frequent and reliable service that allows our residents to travel more easily between all the islands, and we believe the additional capacity and new fares will encourage that," said Peter Ingram, Hawaiian's executive vice president and chief commercial officer.

The new fare structure complements the additional neighbor island capacity and routes Hawaiian introduced earlier this year. Over the past year, Hawaiian has increased capacity by 13 percent and created a Maui hub to increase service between the Valley Isle, Kaua'i and Hawai'i Island. The turbo-prop subsidiary will allow Hawaiian to further expand capacity with daily flights to rural areas.

Hawaiian has offered "Hawaiian Saver" fare sales over the last several months as a way to test customer response to a variety of pricing options, explained Ingram. The Hawaiian Saver fare, which has some restrictions, proved to be attractive to highly cost-conscious travelers. As a result, Hawaiian Saver fares will now anchor the airline's fare structure as a restricted "guaranteed lowest available fare." All other base fares have also been reduced to provide attractive pricing throughout the day on all of Hawaiian's 170 daily neighbor island flights.

"By offering a greater variety of pricing options across our flight schedule every day we hope to make it easier for people to take the extra trip they might not have taken if the lower fares weren't available," said Ingram. "Having said that, it will always be true that the best value is available to those who book early on HawaiianAir.com, and we encourage all of our customers to do that."

#### Hawaiian Increases Seoul Flights to Daily

Starting today, Hawaiian Airlines is increasing the frequency of its nonstop flights between Honolulu and Seoul, South Korea to daily service. The airline has been operating four flights per week since launching the route in January 2011.

By increasing to daily flights Hawaiian is adding more than 40,000 new air seats annually to the Honolulu-Seoul route, and will provide more than 96,000 air seats in total over a full year.
