Waikiki Sewer and Rehabilitation Project

On Friday, August 3rd the Waikiki Sewer and Rehabilitation Project will be working on Kūhiō Avenue (from Seaside Ave to Nahua Ave) from 8:30 am to 3:30 pm.

They will also be working overnight on Kūhiō Ave (from Kalaimoku Ave to Seaside Ave) on Monday, August 20 from 7pm till Tuesday, August 21st 3:30pm.

Project Recap: Work to be performed is the rehabilitation of 6,000 linear feet of various pipe sizes including 10", 16", 18", 20", 21", 24", and 30" sewer line using the Cured-In-Place-Pipe method (CIPP). This is a process which involves building a new pipe inside the existing pipe with limited community disruption.

While we are rehabilitating the existing pipeline, a temporary diversion of existing sewage flow will be required. You will notice some pumps and pipes above the ground, as well as our lining equipment, during the installation process. Other work to be performed include cleaning and chain-knocking of corroded cast-iron pipe, cleaning of terra-cotta and vitrified clay pipe, construction of a new sewer manhole, rehabilitation of existing sewer manholes, and a point repair requiring open trench excavation.

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DFS Galleria Waikiki to Attempt Guinness World Records® Feat

To celebrate the upcoming Art of Hawaiian Coffee event, DFS Galleria Waikiki will attempt to create the world's largest coffee mosaic art from cups of coffee.

The current record holder in this category is the Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority for The Rocks Aroma Festival in Sydney, Australia on July 22, 2009. It consisted of 3,604 cups of coffee in different shades and depicted Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa.

DFS Galleria Waikiki employees will be making the attempt with approximately 6,000 cups of coffee with an image created from 10 different shades of coffee. The design of the mosaic will be revealed as the cups are placed during the world record attempt.

The image that will be revealed is internationally recognizable with ties to Hawaii and its culture. The public is invited to attend this record-making attempt.

GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS® will have an official adjudicator on site. This mosaic art will then be recreated during the second Art of Hawaiian Coffee event which showcases Hawaii coffee growers and their specialty coffees. Hawaiian coffee-related activities include free samplings, children's activities, an exhibition on the Hawaii Coffee story and a Latte Art Competition. The mosaic demonstration will occur on Wednesday, August 22, between 1 p.m. and 4 p.m.

Hawaiian Begins Ticket Sales for Auckland Service

Same-Day Connections Between North America and New Zealand

Hawaiian Airlines today began selling tickets for its new service to Auckland, New Zealand, starting with its lowest everyday fares for travel originating from Honolulu, Hawai'i's neighbor islands, and the airline's 11 gateway cities in North America. Subject to government approval, the new service launches March 13, 2013.

New Zealand is renowned among travelers worldwide for its fascinating Maori culture and spectacular natural wonders, including golden-sand beaches, lush rainforests, fjords and glaciers.

Beginning March 13, Hawaiian's Flight HA 445 will depart Honolulu International Airport at 1:45 p.m. every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, cross the international dateline, and land at Auckland Airport at 9:55 p.m. the following day.

Beginning March 14, the return flight HA 446 will depart Auckland at 11:55 p.m. every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, cross the international dateline, and arrive in Honolulu at 9:45 a.m. the same day.

Martin Cendoya Reserva 2006

Ugarte's 2006 Martin Cendoya Selección Reserva is a blend of 80% Tempranillo, 15% Graciano, and 5% Mazuelo sourced from 100+ year old vines and aged in oak for 14 months. It reveals an alluring nose of lavender, incense, smoke, mineral, and black cherry. On the palate it is layered, opulent, and satin-textured with enough underlying structure to evolve for another 3-5 years. This impeccably balanced wine will be at its best from 2013 to 2026. 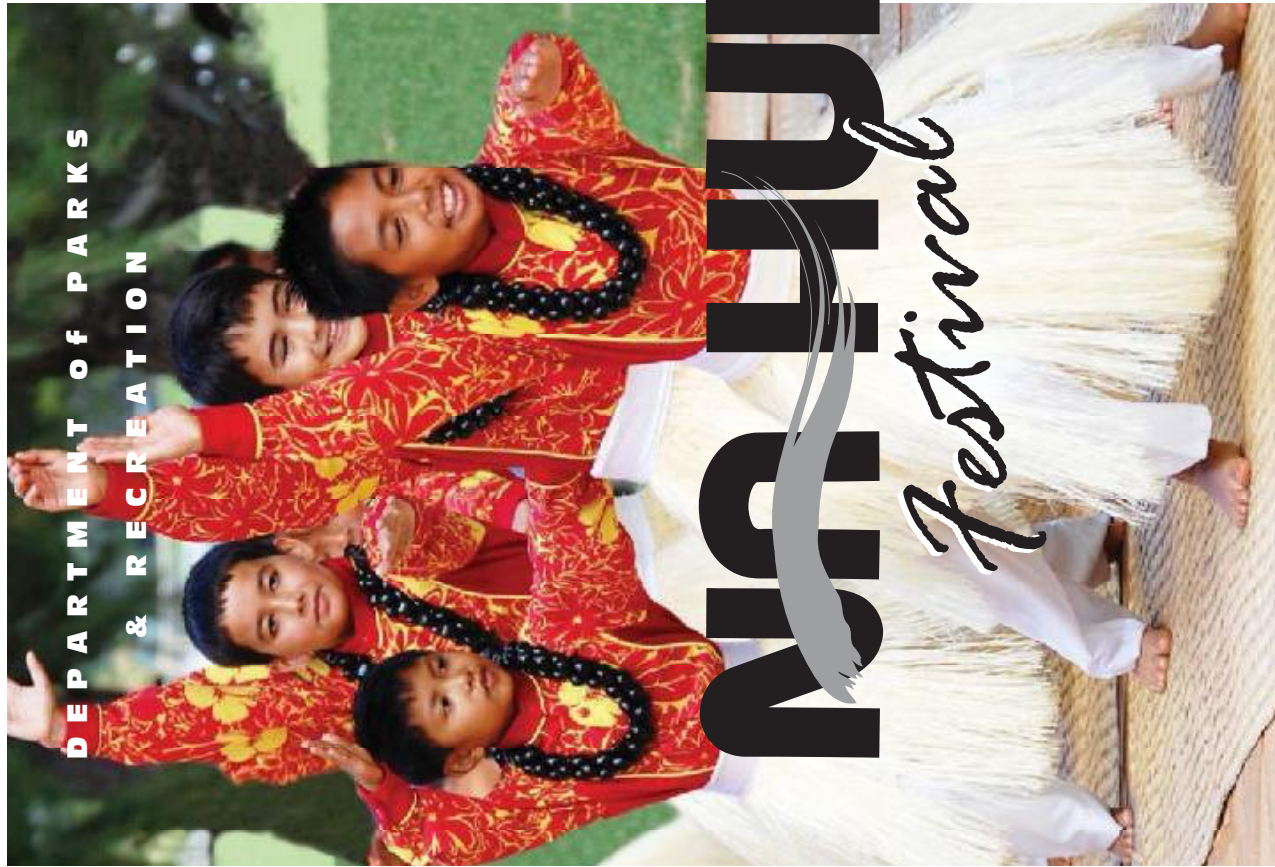

Hawaiian Partners With China International Travel Service On Hawai‘i Tours

Hawaiian Airlines has joined with interline partner Air China and China International Travel Service (CITS) to offer a new premium tour product designed to promote Hawai‘i vacations to the burgeoning outbound travel market in China.

In conjunction with CITS’s new product line, “*Next Stop Hawai‘i, The Most Beautiful Place To Go,*” Hawaiian has begun flying groups of Chinese visitors to Hawai‘i from Seoul Incheon International Airport. Incheon’s standing as a major hub for flight connections in Asia was a key factor in Hawaiian’s decision to launch service between Honolulu and Seoul in January 2011.

“We see great potential in China as a new source for visitors who enjoy coming to Hawai‘i and we are already carrying significant numbers on our flights from Seoul,” said Peter Ingram, Hawaiian’s executive vice president and chief commercial officer. “Partnering with CITS, the largest tourism enterprise in China, gives us tremendous insight and access to the market as we continue to diversify our business and develop our route network.”

According to the most recent visitor statistics released by the Hawai‘i Tourism Authority (HTA), arrivals to Hawai‘i from China jumped 42.9 percent to 49,171 visitors in the first half of 2012. This upward trend is expected to continue, coupled by an increase in the marketing of Hawai‘i as a travel destination and improvements made to expedite the process for granting U.S. travel visas.

The CITS partnership follows other recent business development initiatives undertaken by Hawaiian to pursue the China outbound travel market.

In February, Hawaiian opened sales offices in Shanghai and Beijing to promote Hawaiian’s brand among travel providers and market the airline’s range of services to China consumers.

On July 15, Hawaiian boosted capacity on its Seoul-Honolulu route by 75 percent, increasing the frequency of its nonstop flights to daily service from four flights per week. The move added 40,000 new air seats annually to the market in part to accommodate the growing number of travelers making flight connections on Hawaiian from cities in Asia, particularly China.

This week Hawaiian is launching a Chinese-language website (www.HawaiianAirlines.com.cn) featuring travel information and eye-catching imagery to promote Hawai‘i’s brand among China travelers.

Hawaiian is also actively recruiting Mandarin-speaking flight attendants to better serve its growing influx of customers from China.

Hawaiian Partners with JTB on Sendai-Honolulu Charter Flights

Hawaiian Airlines is flying the first of four nonstop charter flights this Saturday between Sendai, Japan and Honolulu in collaboration with Japan Travel Bureau (JTB).

Mark Dunkerley, Hawaiian's president and CEO, commented, "We are so pleased to be working with JTB to bring travelers to Hawai'i from a region that was so completely devastated only 16 months ago, and we look forward to welcoming these visitors to the islands with our special brand of service."

Located 180 miles north of Tokyo on the Pacific Coast of Honshu Island, Sendai is the capital city of Miyagi Prefecture and the largest city of the Tohoku Region, with a population of approximately one million residents. The Sendai region was at the center of destruction caused by the earthquake and tsunami of March 11, 2011.

The response to Hawaiian's charter service has been strong from Sendai. Saturday's flight is booked to 95 percent capacity.

The four charter flights will depart from Sendai Airport on Saturday, July 21, Thursday, July 26, Tuesday, July 31, and Sunday, August 5 at 8:00 p.m., cross the international dateline, and arrive at Honolulu International Airport the same day at 8:35 a.m.

The return charter flights will depart Honolulu on Wednesday, July 25, Monday, July 30, Saturday, August 4, and Thursday, August 9 at 3:10 p.m., cross the international dateline, and arrive in Sendai at 6:00 p.m. the following day.

Hawaiian will operate the Sendai-Honolulu charter flights using its wide-body, twin-aisle Boeing 767-300ER aircraft, which comfortably seats 262 passengers in a two-class cabin – 18 in Business Class and 244 in the Main Cabin.

Travelers in Japan have enthusiastically received Hawaiian's brand of service since the airline entered the market in November 2010.

Along with the Sendai charter flights, Hawaiian offers daily nonstop service to Honolulu from three gateway cities, Tokyo, Osaka, and Fukuoka. In addition, Hawaiian is launching thrice-weekly nonstop service to Honolulu from Sapporo on October 30, 2012.

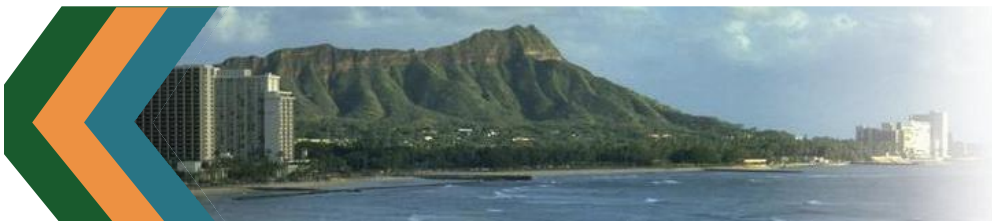
