# "DIANA" Waikīkī Beach Clean-Up

The Waikīkī Improvement Association teamed up with the DIANA Company to clean-up Waikīkī Beach on Tuesday, February 16.

The DIANA Company, a Japanese firm that distributes ladies lingerie, beauty and health products is a socially and environmentally aware organization that has participated in various "social contribution" activities in Japan. DIANA President Mr. Honma Tokuda wanted to make a similar effort in Hawai'i. He offered to sponsor a beach clean-up in Waikīkī. With the support of the Hawai'i Convention Center staff, the Waikīkī Improvement Association and the Sea Grant Waikīkī Coastal Coordinator 240 DIANA Company members scoured the beach. The contribution was recognized by the City when Mayor Mufi Hannemann, represented by Mark Scalzone, declared Tuesday, February 16 DIANA Company Day in Honolulu.

Over the last ten years the Diana Company has made 6 trips bringing over 13,000 members to the Aloha State. This year there were over 1,000 attendees attending the DIANA event at the Hawai'i Convention Center and staying at the Hilton Hawaiian Village and the Sheraton Waikiki.



## Royal Hawai'ian Heritage showcases Hawai'i's Heritage

Waikiki, meaning "spouting waters", was once he favored retreat for Hawaiian royalty. Here at Helumoa in the heart of Waikiki, they spent their days in the shade of more than 10,000 coconut trees.

At The Royal Grove, a lush garden at the heart of Royal Hawaiian Center, is a bronze statue of Princess Bernice Pauahi Bishop, great-granddaughter of King Kamehameha. Here at Helumoa, she penned the last codicil to her will, establishing Kamehameha Schools, dedicated to educating children of Hawaiian descent.

Today, Royal Hawaiian Center is the Schools' largest real estate asset, generating revenue to continue providing education for Hawaiian children.



Enjoy three short films on the heritage and history of this land and the vibrancy of the Native Hawaiian People for free at the Kaulani Heritage Room.
