The group met at 7 am at the Duke Kahanamoku Statue and spread throughout Waikīkī Beach for the morning clean-up campaign.

"We are grateful to all the people who got up early on Saturday morning to participate in Waikīkī's efforts to cleanup the beach in support of Earth Day," said Rick Egged, WIA President. "It's great to see Waikīkī Beach get a through cleaning. It's a wake-up call to always be conscious of trash and pollution to our beaches and our 'āina."

Crazy Shirts donates proceeds from Tsunami T-Shirt to American Red Cross

Honolulu-based Crazy Shirts has donated \$7,500 in proceeds from the sale of its popular Tsunami Survivor commemorative t-shirts to the American Red Cross in support of its International Response Fund.





Hawai'i Convention Center receives 12th consecutive Prime Site Award

The SMG managed Hawai'i Convention Center has received their 12th consecutive Prime Site Award from Facilities & Destinations magazine and is one of 27 other convention center facilities managed by SMG nationally with wins this year.
