Eight Inc. wins Grand Award for 280 Beach Walk The Building Industry Association - Hawai'i 2010 Awards

Architecture and design firm, Eight Inc. was presented a Grand Award by the Building Industry Association, Hawai'i for 280 Beach Walk in Waikīkī. The building won in the New Commercial projects over 15,001 square feet category.

The 280 Beach Walk retail complex continues the redevelopment trend that defines a key gateway experience for Waikīkī, Honolulu's most active pedestrian district.

280 Beach Walk adds over 34,000 square feet of high-end lifestyle retail space to Waikīkī's Kalākaua Avenue. The architecture of the building is created with thoughtful attention to hierarchy, detail, material and color in a manner that allows the project to naturally derive its identity from the



context of the project site. Pedestrians are greeted by a building expression composed of a series of two-story storefronts each accentuated by a dramatic glazed-tile roof form in a way that recalls the street-oriented building traditions of Hawai'i's earliest places of commerce.

2010 Pan-Pacific Festival Celebrating Cultural Exchange in Hawai'i

The Pan-Pacific Festival, one of the oldest intercultural festivals will once again be promoting relationships between Hawai'i and the Pan-Pacific region.

From June 11 - 13, a roster of very notable Hawaiian entertainers along with thousands of musicians, artists and dancers from Pacific Rim countries come to the island of Oʻahu, Hawaiʻi, to present a weekend showcase of entertainment, celebration of drums, dance, pageantry, parades, music, traditions and food. Since its inception, the mission of the Pan-Pacific Festival has been to showcase cultural diversity and overcome language and geographic barriers through shared interests. Most events are free.

The following are highlights of the Pan-Pacific Festival on O'ahu:

Pan-Pacific *Hoʻolauleʻa* – The highlight of the Festival! On Friday, June 11, 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., Waikīkī's famous main street, Kalākaua Avenue, will be closed to cars and packed with pedestrians for this *hoʻolauleʻa* (street party). There will be nine stages filled with cultural performances including hula, traditional Japanese dance and taiko drummers. In addition, food booths, arts and crafts and multi-cultural exhibits will make this an evening to remember.

Pan-Pacific Parade – On Sunday, June 13, 5:00 p.m. visitors and *kama'aina* (residents) will line Kalākaua Avenue to enjoy this colorful parade. An eclectic mix of performers, *taiko* drummers, modern and traditional dancers and colorful floats will march through Waikīkī at sunset. There will be a variety of musical entertainment from Japan and the mainland U.S. along with local ethnic groups participating in the parade as well.

Weekend festivities will also include a performing arts showcase of cultural demonstrations from the Pan-Pacific

Jerry Santos of Olomana, and his friends including Haunani Apoliona, continues to wow audiences each Friday and Saturday evening at the resort's Tapa Bar between 8 and 11 p.m. Santos is now in his 17th year performing at the Hilton Hawaiian Village. 


