



Ala Moana Trunk Sewer Rehab Project

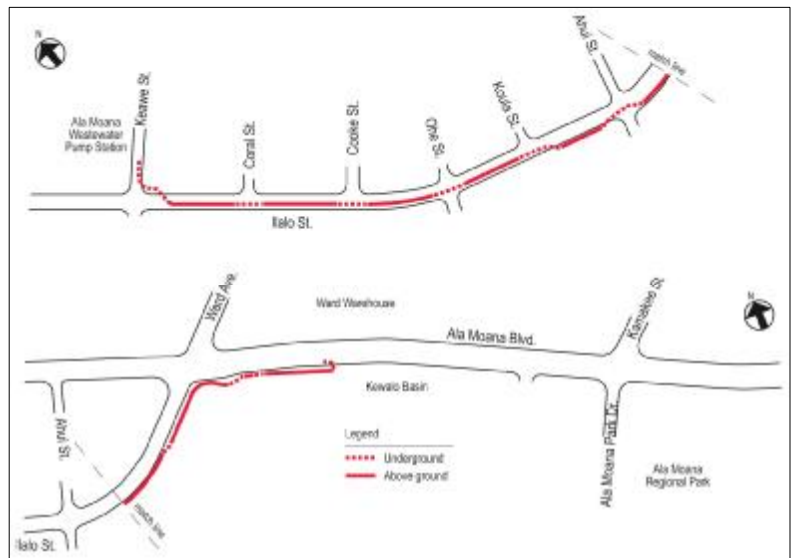
The 69-inch diameter Ala Moana Trunk Sewer is a critical City sewer line which conveys sewage from most of Waikiki. Internal television inspections determined that the portion of the nearly 50-year old trunk sewer, located at Ala Moana Boulevard (between Keawe and Ahui Streets) require rehabilitation.

The project will repair approx. 1,400 linear feet of the existing sewer using the ‘trenchless’ cured-in place pipe method (see photos) and will require diverting sewage from the trunk sewer into a temporary bypass line.

Major project challenges include providing traffic control for the around-the-clock bypassing of approx. 42 million gallons of sewage per day and coordination with a major DOT project that includes the same section of Ala Moana Boulevard.

Construction is tentatively scheduled of start in November 2010 and completed by October 2011. Some inconveniences to the public will be unavoidable but the goal is to minimize the potential impacts.

DESCRIPTION Outrigger and OHANA Hotels commemorate Princess Ka'iulani's birthday with a lei-draping ceremony at her statue in Waikīkī, and a brief program. The Princess Ka'iulani statue was commissioned in 1999 by Outrigger Hotels & Resorts and the Kelley family as part of their commitment to restoring Waikīkī's history and honoring the life of the princess.

BACKGROUND At the time of her birth, Victoria Ka'iulani Kalaninuiāhīlāpalapa Kawēkiūi Lunalilo (1875-1899) was third in line to the Hawaiian throne, and the happy event was celebrated with gun salutes and tolling bells. When her aunt, Liliuokalani, became Queen, Princess Ka'iulani was named heir to the throne but never assumed it due to the overthrow of the Hawaiian monarchy in 1893, despite her diplomatic pleas to Washington to return the Hawaiian government to her aunt. Much to the sorrow of her people, the young princess met with an untimely death at the age of just 23 after falling ill with a lingering cold.

REEF FISH ID TRAINING: Join Reef Watch Waikiki to help monitor and identify reef fish in the Waikiki Marine Life Conservation District. Our "Fish Watch" monitoring program uses a roving survey method developed by the Reef Environmental Education Foundation (REEF) that can be conducted with minimal training and basic snorkel gear. After being trained, you can conduct a REEF survey anywhere on O'ahu (but we hope you'll help us out in Waikiki once in a while!). The class includes basic coral reef ecology and fish biology, followed by identification tips and common characteristics of different fish families found in Hawai'i.

REEF FISH SURVEY: Snorkel surveys are open to past participants of our REEF Fish ID classes. Anyone wishing to participate should be a strong swimmer, competent snorkeler, and have his/her own mask, snorkel and fins. Each snorkel survey will last approximately 30-40 minutes and involve identifying, counting and recording fish observed in the Waikiki Marine Life Conservation District. After the snorkel, we'll gather on the beach to identify any unknown fish and share sightings of cool marine critters.

W.O.W. BEACH CLEAN-UP: Join the Waikiki Ohana Workforce for a Beach Clean-up on "Make a Difference Day"! Meet at the Duke Kahanamoku Statue in Kuhio Beach Park. Trolleys will depart from the meeting location at 7:00 a.m. and transport participants to either end of Waikiki. Participants will then make their way back to the statue on foot, picking up trash along the way. Event ends back at Kuhio Beach Park by 9:00 a.m. Gloves, bags and continental breakfast provided. ALL are welcome! If you'll be participating with colleagues from an organization or business, remember to wear company t-shirts and have a photo taken.

BEACH WATCH ORIENTATION: Beach Watch volunteers conduct observations along the Waikiki coastline, counting and recording what people are doing on the beach and in the water. After participating in the orientation, you will be equipped with the information and tools needed to get started. This outdoor volunteer opportunity takes as little as one hour a week to complete.

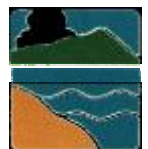
