

Kūhiō Avenue Sewer Rehabilitation

Beginning in February there will be a construction project on Kūhiō Avenue to renovate the sewer lines and associated manholes. A CCTV (closed circuit TV) inspection has shown that the cast iron pipes, vitrified clay

pipes, and terracotta pipes all are in need of repair. Infiltration, corrosion (left), and even holes (right) were found throughout the sewer lines. Some manholes in the area were found to have missing bricks, loose liners, and corroded cover rungs. The project will maintain and repair the structural integrity of the system as well as decrease inflow/infiltration. It will also reduce the risks of sewage spills in the area. This particular section of Waikīkī covers 738 acres and services 20,000 residents, 75,000 tourists and 30,000 workers.





The sewer lines will be refurnished using a method known as "Cured in Place Pipe" or CIPP. CIPP is

aptly described as a "pipe within a pipe". Resin saturated coated felt tubing is inserted in manholes and through existing pipelines. Hot water or steam is then circulated through the tubing, curing the resin and forming a tightfitting, joint less, corrosion resistant pipe. Service laterals are then cut into the pipe using a robotic device. The new line is then closely inspected by CCTV. This pipe within a pipe is one of the least intrusive methods of sewer rehabilitation and has a 50 year design life. Manhole rehabilitation will involve repairing defects and the application of corrosion resistant epoxy coating.



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Impacts of the project will be noise, traffic and possibly odor. The construction will require heavy equipment and power tools. The installation of the CIPP is also a continuous process that will require work during the evening. A

DOH community noise permit has been acquired as the construction will exceed permissible sound levels. Normal permit hours are Monday through Friday 7am-6pm, and Saturday 9am-6pm. Most of the construction will be done during these allotted times. The best available control technology mufflers and enclosures will be used to help mitigate the sound. In terms of traffic, one lane in each direction will be open at all times, and driveway access will be maintained. There will also be relocations of bus stops and restrictions on street parking.

Tentatively the project schedule is as follows.

- The sewer rehabilitation portion will go from February 2012 till August 2012.
- Manhole repair will go from August 2012 till November 2012.
- From November 2012 till March 2013 will be restoration and clean up.

Though when completed this project may not be readily noticeable to the naked eye, it will insure the cleanliness and beauty that all visitors and locals have come to expect when they visit Waikiki.

Waikīkī study of local residents reveals interesting data

WIA has just completed an extensive survey of one thousand local residents done by the Honolulu based firm of SMS Research & Marketing, Inc. The study was done, Egged said, because "although much progress has been made in Waikiki the last ten years, we were not sure how local perceptions of Waikiki had changed. We have heard many people say they don't go to Waikiki any more, but we really had no reliable data to quantify those numbers, or explain what it would take to bring local residents back to Waikiki. What we learned from this study gives us a baseline to better track our local resident visitors and get them into Waikiki more often."

The data showed that seventy three percent (73%) of Oahu residents and forty eight percent (48%) of Neighbor Island adults have been to Waikiki at least once in the past year. They went here primarily to eat in fine dining restaurants, shop and go to the beach. The majority of them, fifty four percent (54%) said they go to Waikiki less often than before. Many of them said crowds and traffic (26%), expensive parking (20%) or "no reason to go" (11%) as reasons to stay away from Waikiki. Those individuals who tended to visit Waikiki in the past year were usually younger and have lived in the islands for less than five years.

Respondents to the survey were asked what they would like to see improved in Waikiki and they mentioned churches, more live shows, cheaper parking, nightlife activities, shopping and casinos. SMS also asked a set of questions that included the option of a new Entertainment Center that would include such amenities as show rooms for local musicians and performers, movie theaters, a gambling casino and even mainland style live shows. When asked how likely it would be for them to visit such an Entertainment Center, seventy six percent (76%) of respondents said they would be very or somewhat likely to go there.

"We asked this question because there is clearly less entertainment to attract local people to Waikiki, especially at nighttime, than in the past," said Egged. "In the 1990s, there were more than a half dozen movie theaters, multiple shows that featured such well- known names as Don Ho, the Cazimero Brothers and more high quality places for music and dancing. Today, there are a few live shows and music places, but there is certainly not as many as in the past. Even all the movie theaters are now gone. All that has probably impacted our visits by local people," he said.

To further understand what it would take to bring more residents into Waikiki, the SMS study also included data about trips to the mainland taken by local people in the past. It found that more than eighty percent (80%) of Hawai'i residents have visited the mainland within the past decade, with forty one percent (41%) having gone there during 2011. In order, the most popular places locals visited on the mainland, primarily for entertainment, were Las Vegas, Los Angeles, and San Francisco. Sixty nine percent (69%) of Hawaii travelers in the survey said they had visited Las Vegas, the most popular destination from Hawaii, an average of 7.3 times in the past decade. The majority of them went to Las Vegas for either the gambling aspect or the entertainment.

Questions were also asked to determine if an Entertainment Center in Waikiki could impact the volume of people visiting Las Vegas on a regular basis. It was found that forty two percent (42%) of those who went to Las Vegas to gamble and fifty four percent (54%) who went there for live entertainment said they would be more likely to stay in Hawaii if a new Entertainment Center were opened in Waikiki. The SMS study also showed that such a Center could generate as much as \$400 million in revenues, especially since seventy six percent (76%) of the people polled said they would visit such an Entertainment Center if it existed.

Given the controversial nature of legalized gambling in Hawai'i, questions were specifically asked about the viability of a Waikiki casino. Fifty eight percent (58%) of local residents said they felt it will have a positive effect on Hawai'i's economy, while thirty seven percent (37%) disagreed. At the same time, fifty four percent (54%) said that legalized gambling will have a negative impact, while forty two percent (42%) did not believe it would have a negative impact. Of those who favored the single casino concept, the majority were lifetime Hawai'i residents, while the majority of those opposed to the casino idea have been residents of the islands for less than five years. Forty four percent (44%) of all people polled, however, felt that Waikiki should be limited to a single casino. Only eight percent (8%) of local residents who do not travel to Las Vegas said they would go to the casino.

Rep. Mazie Hirono addresses bi-partisan Visit USA Act at Waikīkī press conference

At a press conference in the Royal Hawaiian Center Royal Gove, Rep. Mazie Hirono (D- Hawai'i) recently spoke about the bi-partisan Visit USA Act, a bill she co-sponsored with Rep. David Dreier (R-California). This new piece of legislation has the capability to positively influence Hawai'i's tourism industry. The Visit USA Act would allow

for five-year multiple entry visas for visitors from China as well as prolonging the visa time for Canadian retirees from 180 to 240 days. The bill also includes other reforms and visa waiver changes that are designed to propagate tourism in the US. Visit USA Act has also been introduced in the U.S. Senate by Sens. Daniel Akaka (D- Hawai'i), Chuck Schumer (D- N.Y.), and Mike Lee (R- Utah).

Rep. Hirono said "The Pacific region is a vast market for new visitors. Reforming our visa process is a cost-effective, common sense way to make it easier and more inviting for international businesses and tourists to come to Hawai'i and the U.S. It's why this is an idea both Democrats and republicans are behind.

Rep. Hirono's said that, of the 54 million Chinese citizens who traveled abroad only 800,000 visited the U.S. Visitors from China can currently only apply for a one year, multiple entry visa. The Hawai'i Tourism Association has said that tourists from China, on average, spend up to \$350 a day. The new influx of tourists created by this bill could bring revenues up to \$573 million for Hawai'i.

Hawaiian Led Nation in On-Time Airlines Performance for November

Hawaiian Airlines was the nation's top-ranked carrier for punctuality with its flight schedule in November 2011, as reported today in the *Air Travel Consumer Report* issued by the U.S. Dept. of Transportation (DOT).

Hawaiian achieved a 92.0 percent on-time performance with its flights during November to earn the DOT's #1 ranking for the nation's 16 largest carriers covered by the report.

Additionally, Hawaiian ranked second overall in the airline industry for fewest flight cancellations in November, with only six cancellations reported out of 5,324 total flights, or 0.1 percent.

Hawaiian is the largest provider of air service to Hawaii from the Western U.S. with daily nonstop flights from 10 gateway cities on Airbus A330-200 and Boeing 767-300 aircraft, making it the only carrier to use wide-body aircraft for all transpacific flights.



On Sunday, January 15, 2012, the installation of sheet piles will be performed between Cooke and Ahui Streets. This will require the closure of one left lane in both directions along Ala Moana Boulevard between Cooke Street and Ward Avenue. The continuation of the sheet piling and installing manholes will continue for several more weeks. The work will move east towards Ward Ave. as each manhole installation is completed. The next sheet piling activity is tentatively scheduled for the following Sunday, January 22, 2012. Trench work will follow thereafter. Updates will be provided as the work progresses.

The Department of Health (DOH), Department of Transportation (DOT), and GBI are working together to ensure all efforts are being made to minimize the impact to the residents and businesses in the area.
