Air Australia suspends flights

Air Australia announced today that it has suspended all flights, including two from Honolulu to Brisbane and Melbourne, stranding hundreds of travelers.

HTA is working closely with visitor industry partners to ensure that passengers affected by the flight suspensions are able to return home, whether it be to Australia or Hawai'i.

Approximately 500-600 passengers in Hawai'i are expected to be affected by the suspension of the Air Australia flights over the next three days. HTA anticipates that Hawaiian Airlines and other carriers servicing Australia will be able to accommodate the affected passengers.

Hawaiian Airlines is offering a special one-way a "Rescue Fare" to stranded Air Australia passengers. The fare is valid for travel on Hawaiian's daily flights between Honolulu to Sydney through Thursday, March 1, 2012 at \$300 USD for Honolulu departures and \$300 AUD for Sydney departures, all taxes and fees inclusive.

The Rescue Fare must be purchased by calling Hawaiian's reservations department at 1-800-367-5320 or at Hawaiian's ticket counters at Honolulu International Airport and Sydney International Airport. Travelers booking the fare will be required to present their Air Australia ticket or itinerary information when checking in for their Hawaiian Airlines flight. Hawai'i residents booking the fare for a return to Hawai'i from Sydney will be asked to produce their Hawai'i ID at check in.

"We're offering this special fare to help our friends from Australia return home and not let this unfortunate circumstance tarnish their vacation in Hawai'i," said Mark Dunkerley, Hawaiian's president and CEO. "We also want to help any Hawai'i residents stranded in Australia to get home."

Hawaiian is Nation's #1 On-Time Airline for 8th Straight Year

Hawaiian Airlines extended its industry-leading streak of punctuality in 2011 ranking as the nation's #1 on-time airline for an eighth straight year, according to the U.S. Department of Transportation's *Air Travel Consumer Report* issued today for December and the full year 2011.

For 2011, Hawaiian averaged a 92.8 percent on-time performance ranking #1 in 11 of the 12 months and exceeding the industry average for the year by 13.2 percentage points. For the month of December, Hawaiian's on-time performance was 91.0 percent, ranking second to AirTran Airways at 91.9 percent.

"To achieve a nearly 93 percent on-time rate over the entire year reflects the dedication that Hawaiian's employees bring to the job every day to provide our customers with the very best in service and reliability," said Mark Dunkerley, Hawaiian's president and CEO. "We congratulate AirTran Airways for earning the top spot in December and we look forward to the challenge of regaining that position in 2012."

Hawaiian also had the industry's best overall results for fewest flight cancellations in 2011, earning the #1 ranking in 8 of the 12 months as reported in DOT's monthly reports. Hawaiian had 122 cancellations out of 66,740 total flights in 2011, an average of approximately 0.2 percent for the year. In December, Hawaiian had a nearly perfect score with only two cancellations out of 5,523 total flights.

In the category of passengers denied boarding (or oversales), which are reported quarterly, Hawaiian had the industry's second-lowest rate of 0.11 per 10,000 passengers for 2011, or 92 cases out of more than 8.6 million passengers. Hawaiian also ranked second overall in fourth quarter 2011 with a rate of 0.26 per 10,000 passengers, representing 55 cases out of more than 2.1 million passengers.

Hawaiian Earns First-Ever Aviation Carbon Credits for Reducing Emissions

Environmental Benefits Equal to Removing 700 Cars from Roads Annually

Hawaiian Airlines has earned the first-ever aviation based carbon credits, having reduced its carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions by nearly 22,000 metric tons over the past six years using an innovative, eco-friendly engine washing technology developed by Pratt & Whitney.

“We are proud to be the first airline to receive verified carbon credits for reducing emissions,” said Mark Dunkerley, president and CEO of Hawaiian Airlines. “Importantly, engine washing with coPower® is helping us to mitigate rising fuel costs and significantly reduce Hawaiian’s carbon footprint at the same time.”

A carbon credit is a verified means of measuring the reduction of industrial CO₂ emissions from the environment, with one credit equal to the removal of one ton of CO₂. Hawaiian’s earning of carbon credits has been quantified and certified under the Verified Carbon Standard, the world’s leading independent standard for the measurement and verification of greenhouse gas emissions and the creation of carbon credits.

Hawaiian’s reduction of CO₂ emissions using Pratt & Whitney’s patented EcoPower engine washing system has had the equivalent effect of taking 700 cars off the road annually. In addition, since launching the program in 2005, Hawaiian’s commitment to the engine-washing system has saved the company more than 2.5 million gallons of fuel, along with an estimated 26,000 gallons of water that would have been used with traditional washing methods.

“It is appropriate that our first EcoPower customer, Hawaiian Airlines, is also the first customer to be awarded Verified Carbon Units as a result,” said Rick Deurloo, vice president, Pratt & Whitney Sales, Americas.

The EcoPower system reduces fuel burn and eliminates three pounds of CO₂ for every pound of fuel saved, while also reducing engine temperatures and normal wear. It uses pure, atomized water to wash aircraft engines in a closed-loop system that filters contaminants and reuses water, eliminating potential contaminant runoff. The system is more effective and faster than traditional engine washing processes.

Hawaiian’s engine washing program is part of a broader continuous effort to mitigate high fuel costs and their impact on its customers. The company has commitments to acquire a fleet of new, more fuel efficient aircraft valued at more than \$8 billion and has installed performance-enhancing winglets, lighter passenger seats and lighter service carts on its existing wide-body fleet.

Hawaiian employs a number of other measures to reduce its carbon footprint, including a variety of other fuel conservation measures, recycling of waste materials and use of renewable and biodegradable resources in onboard meal packaging and utensils.

PACIFICHEM to Bring 2015 Meeting to Hawai'i Convention Center

The Hawai'i Convention Center will host the seventh International Chemical Congress of Pacific Basin Societies (PACIFICHEM) in December 2015.

The meeting is the seventh in a series of PACIFICHEM congresses. PACIFICHEM has been held in Honolulu nearly every five years since its founding in 1984 with 3,871 attendees. The event was first held at the Center in December 2010, beating initial estimates with more than 12,500 attendees and a record 13,000 research papers submitted from 72 countries. The success of the 2010 event was due in part to the Center's international marketing program, which helps associations build attendance from countries throughout the Pacific Rim.

"Hawai'i has exceeded our expectations every year, and we are excited to bring PACIFICHEM back to Honolulu in 2015," said Nancy Todd, CMP, manager of American Chemical Society Meetings & Expositions Attendee Services & Contracts.
